Theme: Beliefs and Meaning

Key Question: Does belief in Akhirah (life after death) help Muslims lead better lives?

Religion: Islam

- Give examples of times when choices have been influenced and may have changed when one considered the consequences that might follow.
- Explain how believing in Akhirah influences Muslims to do their best to lead good lives.
- Recognise what motivates or influences one to lead a good life and compare it with what motivates and influences Muslims.

Design and Technology

Food: Come Dine with Me

- To research and design a three-course meal
- To prepare a meal using a recipe
- To understand where their food comes from
- To write up a recipe

Textile: Stitching

- To research and analyse a range join materials techniques
- To design a mobile phone case / book cover / pillow case
- To make and stitch together parts of different materials
- To assemble materials in various joining techniques: stitching, glue, staple

Science: Evolution and Inheritance – Part 2

- Recognise that living things have changed over time and that fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the Earth millions of years ago
- Recognise that living things produce offspring of the same kind, but normally offspring vary and are not identical to their parents
- Identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaptation may lead to evolution.

Computing: Skills showcase Inventing a product

- Evaluate code, understanding what it does and adapt existing to code for a specific purpose.
- Debug programs and make them more efficient using sequence, selection, repetition or variables.
- Design appropriate housing for their product using CAD software, including any input or output devices needed to make it work.
- Create an appealing website for their product, aimed at their target audience which explains what their product is and what it does, using persuasive language.
- Create an edited video of their project, articulating the key benefits.
- Describe and show how to search for information online and be aware of the accuracy of the results presented
