We have a lot planned for the children at Mayville so please check the newsletter or website for all updates.

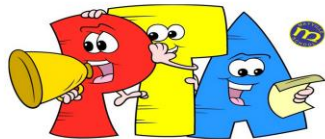
Please make sure you sign and return any trip letters so your children do not miss out on the opportunities that we provide for them.

Dear Parent/Carer,

I am writing to inform you that Mayville Primary School will be taking part in a multi-agency project between Waltham Forest Council, Waltham Forest Police and our school. It is called Operation Encompass.

Encompass has been implemented to help schools provide appropriate support for children who have been present during an incident of domestic abuse or violence. The school will receive a confidential phone call from the Police before 9:00 a.m. on the morning after any incident involving domestic abuse if children have been present.

The school has designated Ms. Varndell and Ms. Klein as key adults. They have received training from Waltham Forest Police and Waltham Forest Council to allow them to use the information that has been shared in confidence to make sure that the right support is available for child/ren and families affected.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to our pupils and we believe this will be beneficial for those involved. If you have any concerns or questions, then please contact Ms. Varndell and she will be happy to discuss the project.
