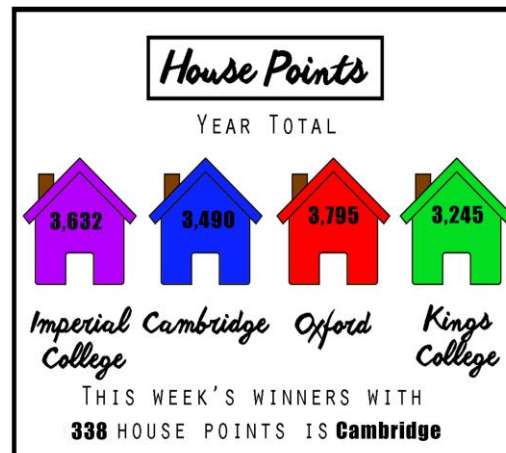

Advice on medication in school

Medicines that need to be taken three times a day should be taken in the morning, after school, and at bed time, so they do not need to be administered in school.

If the parent or carer requests that the school administer medication (**prescribed only**), the Head Teacher will only allow this on the condition that the school's Permission to Dispense Medication form is completed and signed by the parent or carer **with parental responsibility**. If the instructions have not been given in writing, it will not be possible for the school to accept responsibility for administering the medication.
Paracetamol/Nurofen will only be administered if prescribed by a Doctor.
