I look forward to seeing you in the play/school grounds and hearing your ideas, or even just a hello.




Olivia (PTA Events Co-ordinator)






What an exciting start to the half term! Year 3 have enjoyed starting their new topics and have presented some beautiful projects for history. Fatima even made a pyramid, which opened to reveal a mummy's tomb complete with exciting Egyptian facts!

In literacy, Roald Dahl class have been getting ready for World Book Week by exploring our class author Roald Dahl! We took part in a Roald Dahl library club so we can share and recommend stories. After researching the life and works of Dahl, we put all these ideas together to complete a Roald Dahl fact file.








Rulers at the ready because this topic is all around measurements. Year 3 have started to use millimetres and centimetres to measure objects and even could convert between them. They loved exploring the measurements of our classroom.







Forces and Magnets is our science topic this term, Cressida Cowell and Roald Dahl class conducted an interesting experiment to see how friction affects the movement of an object. They used many types of materials such as sandpaper, towels, wood and bubble wrap to see which caused the least amount of friction! Well done year 3!

This term we have started dance lessons. Our first lesson was really interesting and fun! The theme for this term is space. We focused on using our bodies to represent different elements of space, for example, moonwalking and rocket explosions.













On Monday, year 4 took part in a drama workshop on antibullying. Through drama and role play activities, we explored what bullying is, why people might bully, how it feels to bully, as well as what we can do to prevent bullying.















YFAR 4

We ask for a donation of £1 in honour of these activities and the proceeds will be used towards procuring more reading books for our children to enjoy.






Award-winning poet/author, Neal Zetter, visits Mayville Primary School, Tuesday, 8 March 2022
