Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents and Carers

It was great to see so many parents book a place for parents' evening. It was an ideal time for parents to hear about their children's progress and share any concerns. If you missed parents' evening, then please let the office know and they will arrange an appointment with the teacher.

So many of our families have signed up for both the after school clubs and Saturday school, and most clubs are now fully booked. The new Karate teacher was impressed with our children's behaviour and their level of attention. We hope that next term we will be able to offer a few more places in our Saturday school and after school clubs, especially for those children who had missed out this term. A letter will also be issued in the spring term regarding this.

Christmas Activities

Christmas is fast approaching and just like many of the major festivals that we celebrate in school, we have planned a few activities. For our Nursery and Reception families, we have an outdoor nativity, and for the rest of the school, there will be a Christmas choral concert. In addition, Year 2 through to Year 6 will be attending the Christmas pantomime. Please be reminded that places for the Pantomime are limited, so if you have not booked a place then please do so as soon as possible.

School PE Kits

This is a gentle reminder that children must wear the correct PE kit on PE day. They are required to wear a plain white t-shirt (no logos), black or blue leggings or tracksuit bottoms, plimsolls or black trainers. If your child does not have the correct PE kit, then we will call you to bring a change of clothes.

IEPs

At least once a term, teachers will have a telephone or face-to-face conversation with specific parents whose child has been identified as maybe having an academic or behaviour concern. The teacher will discuss the IEP (Individual Education Plan) targets with the parent to ensure that what class teachers are doing is followed up at home. These meetings are vital to ensuring that children are receiving the right support and are making progress.

If you have any time to support your child's school, then this is a great way to show support and make a difference in the education and welfare of our children. 

We have been having a fantastic time in year 2.



Below, we have some clever frogs jumping and counting in steps of 5.











We are half way through the second part of Autumn term. The children have settled greatly and they are all starting to show their potential. Below will showcase all the amazing work they have been doing over the last few weeks.

After understanding all about place value during last half term, year 1 have moved on to learning the number bonds up to ten and using that knowledge when working on the part-whole model. We have also started to add and subtract single digit numbers from one another.





During RE, the children have been learning all about the religion of Christianity including lessons on Christian values; Christians' place of worship; particular items and artefacts that are important to Christians; and identifying different parts of a church.










