### Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we approach the end of term, I would like to thank you for your continued support over the course of this term.

The term has definitely been jam packed, with a range of events, which have been successful because of your support and participation. A massive thank you to all of our Nursery and Reception parents who attended our Nativity this week; it was lovely to have parents back in school attending events again. We look forward to more of these events as the year goes on.

### **IEPs (Individual Education Plans)**

I am sure that by now many of you have received phone calls from teachers regarding your child's IEP and I thank you for engaging with this process. The IEPs will ensure that your child is supported effectively and that you are able to replicate this support at home. The IEPs will be reviewed termly and teachers will update you on changes to your child's targets.

#### Last week of term

We have a number of events coming up next week. The pantomime workshop for Nursery, Reception and Year 1 (The Greediest Elf); and also, trips to the pantomime for Year 2 to Year 6. Christmas parties will also be taking place on Wednesday and Thursday, and children will be able to wear party clothes and bring in party food as long as they are individually wrapped.

### After school clubs and Interventions

This is the last week of after school clubs and interventions. I know many of our children did not get their first club choice last term, but next term we aim to prioritise children who did not get an opportunity to join a club. However, interventions will remain a priority and that means children who are in interventions can only choose clubs that are not on their intervention days.

However, if we see numbers of cases rising, then we know that enforcing restrictions maybe the only measure to ensure we stay safe. We will ensure that families are informed as soon as possible of any new updates.

"Mix the leaves and add the glitter to make the potion"!


## Then we helped 'stickman' to find his family tree!
