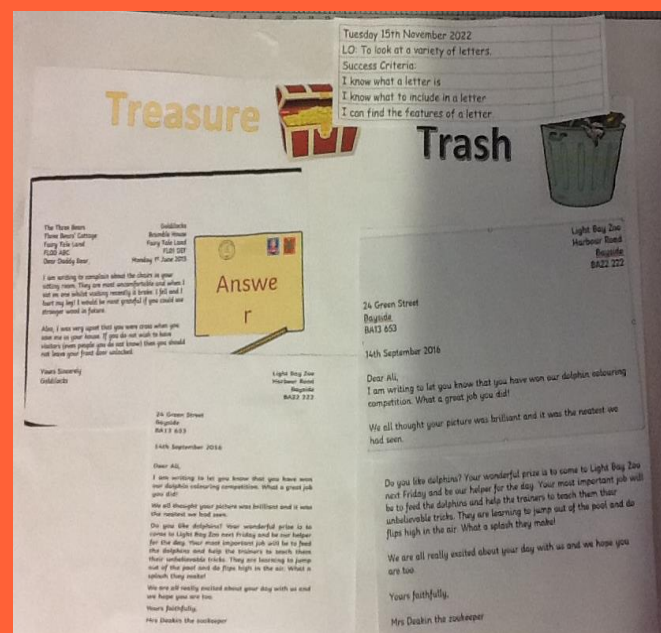
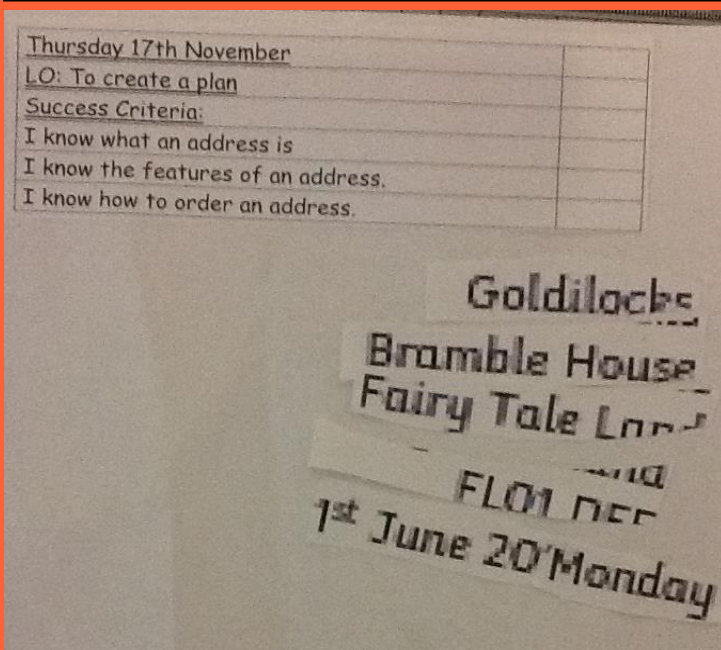

## Year 1 Presentation of Work

With just a few weeks to go before the end of the half term, the Year two children have settled well and have produced some fantastic work. Have a look below.

In literacy, the children have been reading the story of 'Beegu'. They have learnt how to sequence the story and use grammatical features, such as capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.

They have been looking at different types of letters, the features of a letter. They will be writing a letter to Beegu's mum next week.

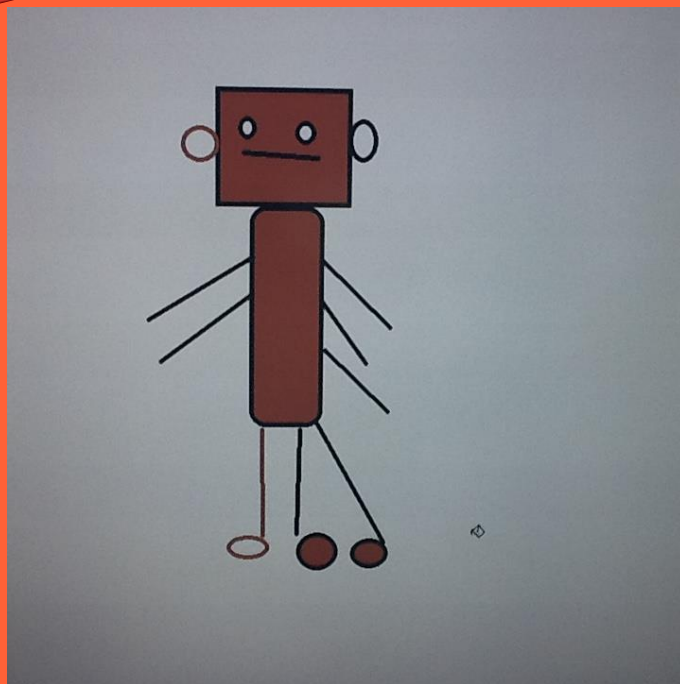
