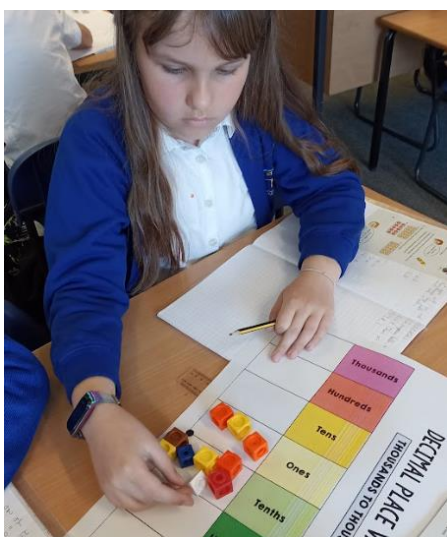

Showcasing the work of our Year 4 Classes

Jamila Gavin and J.K. Rowling have been busy with their learning.

In Maths they have been learning about fractions and decimals.

Children have learned how to add and subtract fractions as well as mixed numbers and can also covert fractions into decimals. They have done this by using place value charts and number lines. We have tried to make these lessons fun and practical, as historically fractions have proven to be a challenging topic for primary school children.

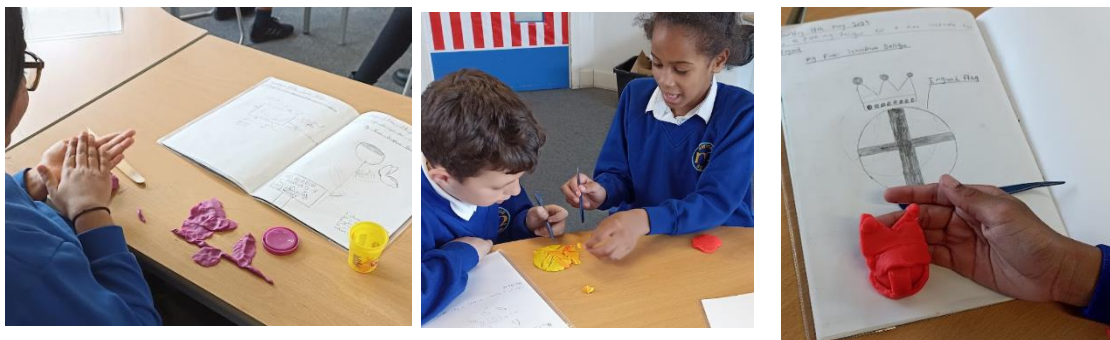




This year, the Year 4 classes visited the Science Museum. They explored different areas and learned a lot about different scientific techniques. These related to their Science topics, such as materials and their properties, electricity and the human body.



In art the Year 4's have been working towards making 3D sculptures. They have thought about a landmark they could create to represent England, their ideas included themes of the King's coronation, Eurovision 2023, England women's football world cup, to name a few. 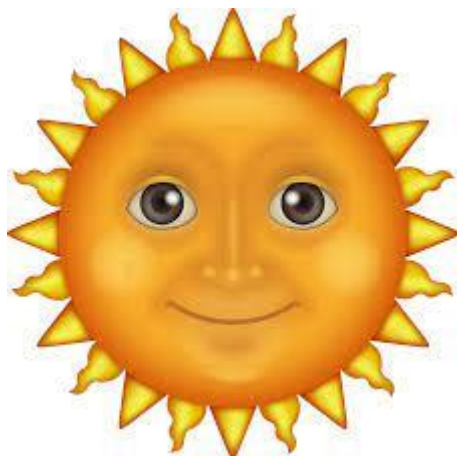
